Applications will only be accepted during those dates and times and with the required items listed above. If you are receiving a basket or certificate from any other agency, services cannot be duplicated. Names of applicants will be cross-referenced with other area organizations. 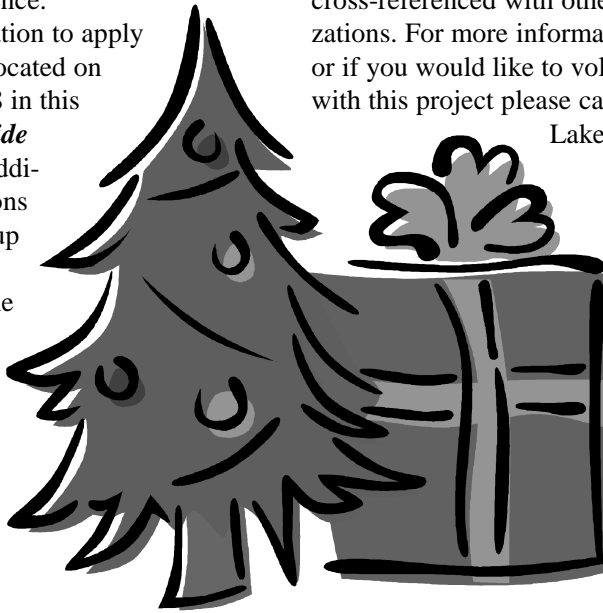

Teaching Kids to be Honest & Caring

Honest

We want our kids to tell the truth—even when it's not easy. But being honest is a tricky thing. There are white lies, half-truths, and withholding information. When we teach our kids to be honest, we help them develop into individuals with tact and compassion.

- ♦ Create a warm, loving, and safe home environment so when your kids make mistakes, they feel they can admit them honestly and seek out your help. When they do admit their errors, be careful in how you respond so you don't shut them down. Yes, they may need to be disciplined, but approach the situation as a learning experience.
- ♦ Kids learn a lot about honesty from the way you act. They notice when you tell lies over the phone—or to a salesperson to get rid of her. Work on being honest yet tactful and respectful to others.
- ♦ Be honest if you're having a hard time doing something, such as losing weight (and you're tempted to sneak cookies) or quitting smoking (and you're tempted to smoke away from the family without them knowing it). Talk about how lying is much more than telling outright lies. It also involves deception and withholding information.

♦ Praise your kids when they're honest with you (even if you're very angry about what they told you). Notice when they're being honest—it's not always easy!

Kids have a lot of opportunities to be dishonest—at home, at school, with their friends, and in many other places. It's up to you to teach them that being honest is the right thing to do, even when it might get them in trouble. Show them through your actions that telling the truth is always the best decision, and they'll follow suit.

Caring

We want our kids to place a high value on helping other people, which is what caring is all about. When we teach kids to care, not only do they learn how to care about themselves, but they also learn how to care for others and make the world a better place.

- ♦ One way to teach children how to care is by having a pet or interacting with a friend's pet. For young children, learning to be gentle and caring are important values. Older kids can learn how to play with a pet and recognize the cues of "come closer" or "give me some space."
- ♦ Whenever your child notices that someone is upset and wants to help, encourage him to act on that impulse. Afterward, talk about how proud you are of your child for caring.

♦ Find a meaningful way for your family to volunteer to help others. For example, serve soup at a food shelf. Deliver a meal to an elderly acquaintance who lives alone. Visit people in the hospital or a nursing home. (Learn more in our Serving Others section.)

♦ When you see news stories about natural disasters or tragedies, get your family together and ask what you can do to help. Maybe you can purchase water and deliver it to a drop-off collection center. Or you could assist a local organization in a relief effort.

By expressing concern for others in various ways, you can set a positive example for your child and let her or him know that caring for others is important. Raising caring kids is something that requires a caring life-style; start thinking about how you act today and see if you can make any changes to be more caring.

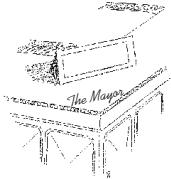

Locust Street is just about finished. The hole in the middle of the street at the east end is where our new entrance sign will be placed. There will also be three flag poles installed in the median at the east end.

There are a few areas left to have the colored concrete installed and some sod work needs to be completed.

Monday, October 17, 2011

Study Session - 5:00 p.m.

Regular City Council Meeting - 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Russ Kramer called the Study Session to order at 5:00 PM.

Roll Call: Present – Mayor Russell D. Kramer

Council members Barb Melonis, Joe Anderson, Ed Aldmeyer, and Ron Cumberledge

Absent – Council member Tim Parker

Also present – City Attorney Joe Thornton and City Clerk Doreen Mowery.

The council discussed various items on the regular agenda for the meeting scheduled at 7:00 PM. Additional information relating to the agenda items was discussed with the council members present. No action was taken on any of the items at this time. MAPA asked to reschedule the presentation of information on the Multi-Jurisdictional Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plan for Pottawattamie County. The Council will hold a special meeting on Tuesday, Nov. 15, 2011 at 5:00 PM regarding an Employee grievance.

The study session was adjourned at 5:10 PM.

Regular City Council Meeting

The Pledge of Allegiance

I. Roll Call: Present – Mayor Russell D. Kramer

Council members Joe Anderson, Ron Cumberledge, and Barb Melonis
Council member Ed Aldmeyer arrived at 7:02 PM.

Absent – Council member Tim Parker

Also present – City Attorney Joe Thornton and City Clerk Doreen Mowery.

II. Approval of the Agenda – The Planning Board update was removed from the agenda. Moved by council member Cumberledge seconded by council member Anderson to approve the agenda with the deletion. Ayes: Unanimous.

III. Consent agenda – Council member Anderson requested that the Board of Adjustments minutes from Sept. 6, 2011 be removed from the consent agenda and placed as item B 4 under the regular agenda for discussion. Moved by council member Cumberledge seconded by council member Melonis to approve the consent agenda with the change. Ayes: Unanimous.

IV. New Business

A. Communications from the Public

1. Linda Steskal requested that the council refund the \$116.00 that she paid for a Jan. 2010 snow removal bill. She found that many of the bills for snow removal had been dismissed. Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Melonis to deny the request. Ayes: Aldmeyer, Melonis. Nays: Anderson, Cumberledge.

2. Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Cumberledge to approve 283 homes for billing at Lakeside Mobile Home Community. Ayes: Unanimous.

B. Communications from the Departments

1. Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Cumberledge to approve the four new fire applications to the department. Ayes: Unanimous.

2. There was no planning board update at this time.

3. Mayor Kramer reported that the city took down the parking signs at 11th and Ave. K that were installed temporarily for the Locust Street construction detour. An area resident asked to have the signs installed permanently. There are also signs at 7th and Wood that were installed temporarily. Council member Anderson would like to see the people in the neighborhood that are making the request come before the council to make the request. Council member Melonis would like the police department to do some spontaneous monitoring of the speed limit at 11th and Ave. K. Moved by council member Cumberledge to install the stops signs permanently at 11th and Ave. K and 7th and Wood Ave. Motion died due to the lack of a second. The Mayor will contact the citizens that were requesting the stop signs and let them know they need to come before the council with their request.

4. Council member Anderson pulled the Sept. 6, 2011 Board of Adjustments minutes for discussion. At that meeting the Board of Adjustments denied the request for a six-foot fence on the front of a property. Council member Anderson stated that there is an individual that is building a house that has a six-foot fence along the street side of the home and he assumes there is no building permit or variance for the six-foot fence. The mayor stated that the lake is the front yard of the property and that the fence is actually in the back yard. Council member Anderson questioned why there is no sidewalk for that property. Moved by council member Anderson seconded by council member Cumberledge to place the board of adjustments minutes back on the consent agenda and to approve them for file. Ayes: Unanimous.

V. Ordinances

A. Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Melonis to adopt an ordinance to amend Chapter 69 for a no parking zone on the third consideration. Council member Anderson mentioned that there is no sidewalk on the abutting property. Ayes: Aldmeyer, Cumberledge, Melonis. Nays: Anderson.

B. Moved by council member Melonis seconded by council member Anderson to approve amending Section 305 of the Unified Land Development Ordinance to add a section for safety services on the third consideration. Ayes: Unanimous.

VI. Resolutions

A. Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Anderson to approve a resolution adopting a pre-disaster mitigation plan for the City of Carter Lake. Ayes: Unanimous.

VII. Comments

Mayor Kramer reminded everyone that Sherry Rydberg has scheduled a 5K run for Saturday, October 22nd. Proceeds from the event are going to be used to help fund a splash park.

Council member Melonis stated that she will be walking in the event and she invited everyone to join her.

Council member Cumberledge thanked everyone for coming to the meeting.

Regular City Council Meeting

II. Approval of the Agenda – Moved by council member Parker seconded by council

member Melonis to approve the agenda as presented. Ayes: Unanimous.

III. Consent agenda – Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Parker to approve the consent agenda as presented. Ayes: Unanimous.

IV. New Business

A. Communications from the Public

1. Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Melonis to approve renewal of the commercial vehicle parking permits as presented. Ayes: Unanimous.

2. Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Parker to approve the liquor license renewal for Saries Lounge LLC. Ayes: Aldmeyer, Cumberledge, Parker, Melonis. Nays: Anderson.

3. Gerald Waltrip spoke to the council regarding the condition of the lake. He said he will be at every meeting until they clean the mess up. Mr. Waltrip expressed his displeasure with the lack of space he was given in the July 18th minutes regarding his comments on the condition of the lake. He feels his comments were misrepresented in the minutes. Regarding the Locust Street project Mr. Waltrip stated that the contractor did a terrible job on the grinding.

B. Communications from the Departments

1. Sherry Rydberg was present to seek council approval to begin fund raising for the proposed splash pad. The City owns a lot at 65 Carter Lake Club that is being considered for the project. Council member Melonis is concerned about placing the splash pad in the middle of the residences. The Park Department is hoping to raise ¼ of the cost (\$75,000). The Lion's Club is proposing a swim pool and that project may include a splash pad. Council member Anderson would like to see a proposal on paper before moving forward with the project. Kelly Brock wanted information on a survey regarding how much support there is for a swim pool or splash pad. Moved by council member Parker seconded by council member Melonis to approve the Park Department to start fund raising activities for a splash pad park. Ayes: Aldmeyer, Cumberledge, Parker. Nays: Anderson and Melonis. Sherry Rydberg distributed information on the first fund raiser for the project. She has scheduled a 5k and 1K event on October 22nd, to raise funds for the

proposed splash pad.

2. There was no fire department update at this time. Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Parker to approve the two applications that were submitted for the fire department. Ayes: Unanimous.

3. Ray Pauly told the council that the Planning Board met on August 29th. At that meeting they approved the plans for Praxair. The Board would like the City to require Praxair to install a sidewalk while they are making improvements to their property. The current ordinance requires a sidewalk. The Mayor will discuss this with the building inspector to make sure sidewalk installation is included in their building permit.

4. Brad Richardson reported that on September 15th the DNR stocked 2,200 channel catfish in the lake. The pumps have been off for about a week and the lake is now at 970.69 feet. The pumps should come back on at 970.7 feet. Brad reminded people to please be careful with their fall fertilizing and to take precautions to keep the product out of the lake. Brad presented some numbers prepared by NDEQ both pre and post alum treatment. Project goals for the alum treatment and fish kill were met for water clarity, total phosphorus, chlorophyll, algae toxins, and the number of violations/beach posting. The only goal that was not met was for total nitrogen. Council member Cumberledge wanted to know if the other entities are aware of the seaweed issue and if they are willing to assist in getting rid of the problem. The entities are working on a vegetation management plan for next summer. There is a meeting scheduled for October or November to work on solutions for the vegetation issues. Council member Cumberledge wants the City to ask for assistance. The DNR and DEQ are paying for the harvester. Our contribution is the use of manpower to run the machine. Other lakes have had success with the harvester however it hasn't worked that well for us. The technical team has been monitoring the seaweed in the lake. Maintenance has been busy working on flood issues and they have not been harvesting seaweed every day. The maintenance crew has been running the harvester more often since we have stopped pumping flood water. Council member Anderson requested a map of the areas of the lake that the maintenance crews were going to concentrate on while running the harvester. Council member Anderson does not

think we need to be running the harvester if it is not going to be doing any good. The Mayor stated that if the council wants to stop the process they will load up the machine and send it back. Council member Anderson said we do need to guard the area around the pump, however he does not feel there is anything we can do about the seaweed at this time since he feels it has taken over. Council member Melonis expects the weed issue to be addressed at the vegetation management meeting. Jerry Waltrip wants to attend the next Technical Advisory Team meeting.

5. Mayor Kramer would like to thank Terry Lesley for the job that he has done on the Urban Revitalization Committee over the last several years. He would like the council to approve the appointment of Bill Schewe to replace Terry Lesley. Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Cumberledge to approve the appointment. Ayes: Unanimous.

V. Ordinances

A. Moved by council member Parker seconded by council member Anderson to approve an ordinance amending chapter 106 regarding hours of trash collection, on the third consideration. Ayes: Aldmeyer, Anderson, Cumberledge, and Parker. Nays: Melonis. Council member Anderson would like us to contact the trash hauling companies to notify them of the change in the ordinance.

B. Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Parker to adopt an ordinance to amend Chapter 69 for a no parking zone on the second consideration. Council member Anderson has noticed several cars parked on the street during construction. He feels this ordinance is for the convenience of the homeowner. Ayes: Aldmeyer, Cumberledge, Parker, Melonis. Nays: Anderson.

C. Moved by council member Cumberledge seconded by council member Melonis to approve amending Section 305 of the Unified Land Development Ordinance to add a section for safety services. Ayes: Unanimous.

VI. Resolutions

A. Moved by council member Melonis seconded by council member Parker to approve a resolution to address Federal mandates to cities for combined sewer overflow (CSO)

projects. Ayes: Unanimous.

B. Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Cumberledge to approve liens for unpaid utility bills. Ayes: Unanimous.

C. Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Cumberledge to approve the Road Use Tax report for FYE 6-30-11. Ayes: Unanimous.

D. Moved by council member Aldmeyer seconded by council member Melonis to adopt a depository resolution. Ayes: Unanimous.

VII. Comments

Mayor Kramer stated that the various projects are being done on the lake in an effort to comply with EPA standards. It is not a finished project. They will be letting bids this fall for additional construction projects.

Council member Melonis stated that we were all concerned this summer with the possibility of flooding. We escaped the flooding, but our disaster came in the form of a hail storm. She thanked everyone involved in the clean up. Maintenance did a wonderful job with the debris removal and repairing broken water and sewer lines.

Council member Parker thanked everyone for coming to the meeting.

Council member Cumberledge stated that the Locust Street project and the lake project are both very discouraging to him.

Council member Anderson stated that there was some destruction to the sod by the Chez Paree. He believes this is a direct result of the council allowing parking on the grass. He also noted that the house that is being built on Ave. K does not have a sidewalk and that they have installed a 6 foot fence on the front of the property without a variance from the board of adjustments. Council member Anderson thanked all of the volunteers for everything they do for the City.

Council member Aldmeyer thanked Terry Lesley for his service. He also asked the maintenance supervisor to remove the temporary stop signs that were installed on Ave. K during the Locust Street construction.

Fall clean up has been scheduled for Sept. 24, 2011.

Jerry Waltrip wanted to know what would make the canals the high priority for the harvester. Mayor Kramer stated that they are not the priority, keeping the pump clear is the high priority.

Bobby Freeman would like someone to enforce the ordinance that does not allow people to blow grass into the street when they mow. He is concerned that the grass flows down the street into the storm water system and the lake.

John Wallace stated that all of the chemicals in the lake are not coming from Carter Lake. He believes much of it is coming from the storm system in Omaha.

Jerry Bell requested an update on Locust St. The Mayor stated there is one column left to pour. There are some areas of colored concrete, sod, seeding, fence and plantings that remain to be completed. We have not completed a punch list on the project yet and there are several items that will need to be fixed before the job is complete and acceptable.

Council member Anderson stated we need to make sure the cure is stripped off of Locust before we start painting the street markers or they will not last.

Meeting adjourned at 8:13 PM.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

City of Carter Lake Water District Has Levels of Total trihalomethanes Above Drinking Water Standards

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Testing results we received on 9/1/2011 show that our system exceeds the standard or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for total trihalomethanes. The standard for total trihalomethanes is 0.080 mg/L. The average level of total trihalomethanes over the last year was 0.081 mg/L.

What should I do?

- **We would like to reassure all residents the drinking water is perfectly safe to drink. You do not need to use an alternative (e.g., bottled) water supply.** However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.

What does this mean?

This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. However, some people who drink water-containing trihalomethanes in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous system, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

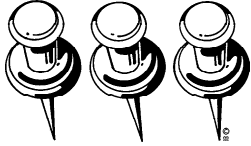
What happened? What is being done?

During the First Quarter of the year we always see higher levels of trihalomethanes this is caused by the "Spring Run Off" of the Missouri River. During this time usually during the months of February and March the ice on the Missouri River and its tributaries melts also snow melt from the river banks run into the river and its tributaries. This run off causes higher levels of organic material (dead grass, leaves, ect) to be found in the water. Trihalomethanes are formed when Chlorine reacts with organic material so the 1st quarter test is always higher. The running average for the year was 81 parts per billion the maximum contaminant level (MCL) is 80 parts per billion: 1 part per billion (or microgram per liter) and corresponds to 1 minute in 2,000 years or 1 penny in \$10 million. So we are a very small amount over the mcl I am confident when I take the samples for 2nd and 4th quarter the level will be lower and the running average will be under the MCL level if not I will send out another letter like this one. Beginning in 2012 the City will be taking more Trihalomethanes samples for the new Epa and DNR requirements this will allow us to closely monitor the Trihalomethanes levels. Also the City of Carter Lake is in the process of updating our Routine Bacteria sample plan anyone that wishes to have their water checked once a year can be put on the sample plan just call Ron or Tim at the numbers below.
